

Democratic Leadership versus Dictatorship

Good governance would require members of parliament to debate and revise proposed legislation so that it becomes responsive to all citizens in an effective and efficient manner. Proper debate requires putting forth arguments in support of and arguments in opposition to proposed legislation without making comments on anything that does not concern the legislation. All arguments put forward must be fact based and not based on hearsay, conjecture, or partisanship.

Proper debate has not been occurring in the House of Commons due to the animosity demonstrated by members of the legislature towards each other based on party affiliation. It is mostly due to the autocratic behaviour of party leaders who have people, known as party whips, coerce their party members to vote in accordance to the leader's wishes. This is not democratic leadership. This is political party leader dictatorship.

A democratic leader does not dictate. A democratic leader enables members of parliament to always represent their constituents when debating and voting on legislation. Democratic leadership is leading people through the democratic process and obtaining their consensus.

Canada uses a single member plurality (SMP), sometimes called first past the post (FPP), electoral system. Here, you vote for a person and not a party. People elected to parliament do not have any legal obligation to any political party or party leader. This system enables members of parliament (MPs) to represent their constituents and not be subjugated by any political party or party leader.

Secret ballots are also used in elections to protect voters from coercion. The use of secret ballots keeps the elected representatives from knowing who voted for them. This eliminates bias and encourages equal consideration by the representatives for all their constituents.

In 2007, the people of Ontario had a referendum on electoral reform and they overwhelmingly voted to keep their democratic right to vote directly for their representatives using the single member plurality (SMP) system instead of the mixed member proportional (MMP) system where people are subjugated by political parties.

For democracy to exist, members of parliament must not submit themselves to the dictates of some political party leader but instead be responsive to the people they represent.

To have good governance in Canada, political party leaders must not dictate; but, instead enable members of parliament to always represent their constituents when debating and voting on legislation.

How the Party Will Restore Democratic Leadership

Our Party is without a whip. It is committed to its four foundational principles: Freedom, Fairness, Personal Responsibility, and Respect. In the House of Commons, the Party's elected representatives will argue for or against proposed legislation based on the Party's core principles. As well, in accordance with our principles, the Party's elected representatives may introduce new legislation that reflects the will of the Association's members, which is defined as a greater than two thirds majority vote.

The Party's elected representative will frequently consult the Association's members and non-members during board meetings and at events like Freedom Fridays and with monthly email surveys on contemporary issues. The Association's members are charged with understanding and teaching the Party's core principles to the non-members. This will have the effect of increasing the Association's membership while restoring democratic leadership to federal politics.

For example, more than two thirds of the Association's members may reasonably argue that the Canadian Pension Plan is unfair, discouraging personal responsibility. Therefore, it would be permissible for a Party's elected representative to table a bill in the House of Commons that would allow Canadians to drop out of the Canadian Pension Plan.

Currently, in violation of Western Democratic principles, Canadians are being subjected to the COVID protocols of the World Health Organization and Davos Group. These protocols are being dictated to

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Canadians by their federal, provincial, and municipal governments with little to no debate. Under the Party's freedom principle, a greater than two-thirds majority of the Association's membership support the tabling of legislation that would bring forth an immediate end to and Royal Inquiry into the federal government's response and handling of COVID.

Party Candidates for the Kingston Regional PPC Association's Three Ridings

In preparation for a federal election of 2021, Party headquarters made two appeals to the public to be candidate Members of Parliament. Applicants were vetted by Party headquarter before being selected or voted in. All candidates pledged to support the Party's foundational principles and platform. The Party's existing platform is deemed to be in accordance with its foundational principles.

Party Promotional Materials and Distribution

The writ has been dropped, thus setting an election date of Monday, September 20th. In anticipation of a snap election, the Association prepared and pre-ordered promotional materials. Volunteers' teams for the distribution of our promotional materials are being set up. As well, custom signs have been sourced and will be available for distribution in about a week.

More donations and volunteers are needed to reach the Association's goal of distributing promotional material to every dwelling in the Association's geographical area. Both members and non-members can sign up to volunteer via the Association's website. Party membership purchases along with donations to both the Association and the Association's candidates can be made via the Association's website, too. We kindly ask that our members pre-order their lawn signs via the website at their earliest convenience.

Events During the Election

Freedom Friday events will be held at the Royal Canadian Legion, Limestone City Branch 560, at 734 Montreal Street on the patio at 7 pm until the end of the federal election. Candidates for Lanark - Frontenac - Kingston and Leeds - Grenville - Thousand Islands and Rideau Lakes will be soon scheduling their own community events. Maxime Bernier will soon be touring through our three ridings over a three-day period. These events will give the Association's members and their Party candidates the opportunity to share the Party's principles and platform with their communities.
